Once again it's that time of year... membership renewals will be **Emailed** to existing members in the next few weeks (and mailed to those who don't have email). So please be on the lookout for your renewal in your "in box"! The Board has decided that in light of the economy, we will keep our rates the same. We understand that everyone has many demands, and we're doing our part too in keeping things in check. We will continue to provide programs, testing opportunities and events as planned. The Board values your dedication and loyalty to our club and wants to do our part in keeping membership affordable.

A few membership reminders:

- ◆ **Very Important!!!! Club Membership Expires on May 31st; USFS Membership Expires on June 30th**
- ◆ **When you receive your Email renewal, print the form and complete with your current information and send it in with your dues (before May 31).** By doing so, you ensure that your membership remains in good standing for any tests taken over the summer or any competitions, and of course for the rest of the skating year. Accordingly, be sure your email is correct – this is the best way for us to communicate and how you receive your Newsletter, club information, as well as your **Club Permission Form** (it will not be snail mailed). This form is important – save it and print it out and provide copies to test chairmen any time you need to take a test out of club, or you need to attach it to a competition application. Note, you do not need to provide this form for DuPage hosted events such as any DuPage sponsored test session, nor for our own DuPage Open.
- ◆ For those who may be new members to our club and this is your first renewal process, the Club Permission Form is required documentation for entering competition events and or test sessions that are not hosted by our own DuPage Figure Skating Club. You will need to attach it to the event's competition form or test application. The document shows the other hosting club/event, that you are a member in good standing of the DuPage FSC. Again, when entering our DuPage Open or taking a test on any of our own DuPage test sessions, you do not need to supply the form.
- ◆ Since our world is communicating more and more via email, it's very important that we have your correct email address. Please be sure that this information is correct on your renewal form as it is how you will also receive your **Club Permission Form**. Additionally, the membership-related emails will be coming from our Membership department (Mr. Gade), so be sure that you recognize this new email: [membership-dfsc@ameritech.net](mailto:membership-dfsc@ameritech.net). This is especially important if you have a spam filter program (which keeps out random emails/spam offers, etc.) as it will need to recognize this as a valid address.

Dear DuPage FSC,

After all these years as a proud member, I would like to start by thanking the DuPage FSC for all of the love and support. I have had quite a journey over the years and am very grateful for being a part of a club that has supported me every step of the way.

This year I definitely had some ups and downs, which is something every skater can relate to I'm sure. For a few years, I have dealt with a recurring back and groin injury which set me back a few times throughout this season. However, as Regionals approached, I felt trained and ready to compete. There was something very special to me about being a senior lady at this event. I went into it proud of my skating and proud of myself. It was very exciting to win the event, and I just couldn't wait to travel to Kansas with all of the great skaters who qualified for Mids.

In three short weeks, Mids would be here so I knew I had to focus and put all of my effort into my training in order to improve. However, the week before I left, I was hit with a major setback. I was diagnosed with the H1N1 flu virus and was sitting home in bed the entire week before the competition. For the few practice days at the event, I did whatever I could to gain my strength and stamina back. It truly was "mind over matter." I needed to accept how my body was feeling and expect to be fatigued. When it was time to compete, I put everything out of my mind and just trusted my previous training and muscle memory. Placing in the top four has never been more rewarding! I was just happy to make it to the end of each program, so making it to my first Nationals, especially as a senior, was icing on the cake. Persistence definitely pays off and it was just the best feeling to know I would be a part of the US Championships!

I wasted no time after arriving home from Kansas. I was never more excited to train in my life. It was very fun to celebrate with my family and friends, but I knew there was lots of work to be done. Unfortunately, I was diagnosed with a stress reaction in my tibia and fibula about a week after returning to the ice. After consulting two different doctors and my physical therapist, Linda Tremain, I decided to take the risk and try to compete. I was off the ice until two weeks before Nationals, however, and even then it wasn't healed all the way. The two weeks back on the ice were definitely a struggle. I barely jumped and had trouble getting through my programs. At this point, I had expected to be a little farther along, so I had to really evaluate the situation and come up with a decision. I knew I couldn't be at my best, but I also knew how rare this opportunity was. After weeks of going back and forth, the Friday before my flight, I decided to go!

You have no idea how happy I am I made that decision! The week in Spokane was indescribable. After sitting and watching the event on TV for years, actually being a part of it was unreal. I just felt honored to be there and to be skating on the same ice as the best in the country. My plan was to enjoy every single second of the experience, despite my injury. Stepping on the ice for my short program, I felt this surge of excitement and energy that only Nationals could bring. The crowd, the lights, the cameras...everything about the environment was thrilling. I skated the very best I could and just soaked it all in. For me, the score did not matter one bit. I was just so proud to fight through the pain. After the short, however, my pain worsened. After talking with my coach and spending a night at the doctors, I decided to withdraw from long. I was more than happy with what I did that week, it was not worth hurting my foot even more. This was an amazing experience that I will cherish forever.

I would like to thank the DuPage FSC again for all of their support and dedication. I also want to thank my wonderful coaches, Cindy Perpich and Leanne Fanning, along with my family and everyone who has helped me along the way. Thank you!

### "My Olympic Experience" – Lisa Fitzmaurice

For as long as I can remember I have loved the Olympics, not just the skating but all of the sports both winter and summer. Every four years I am glued to the television, enthralled by the ceremony, the determination and talent of the athletes, the thrill of the competition and the stories of triumph and sacrifice. It has been a dream of mine to be able to go to an Olympics and this past February my husband and I were fortunate enough to go to the Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympics.

After 1 1/2 years of planning and some help from a cousin in Canada who was able to purchase some of our event tickets, the day finally arrived. The excitement began at the airport, chatting with people who were also on their way to Vancouver, comparing notes about what they were seeing, where they were staying and if they had ever been to an Olympics before. One of the French skating team members, Florent Amodio, was on our plane. So, at the baggage claim in Vancouver, I introduced myself, talked with him about skating and got his autograph. He had been training in Indianapolis and was very nice and excited about competing at his first Olympics.

We arrived on the day of the Opening Ceremony but did not have tickets. We walked over to the venue and luckily were able to buy some from someone selling them on the street. It was amazing to be at the Opening Ceremonies. There were people from many different countries sitting all around us and there was a lot of audience participation. Seeing the athletes from all the different countries march in was thrilling, and hearing K.D. Lang singing "Halejuhah" gave us the chills.

Our first athletic event was Short Track Speed skating. Seeing Apolo Ono skate in person was awesome. The sport is fast and crazy, so when the two Korean skaters wiped each other out leaving Apolo to get the silver and JR Celski the bronze the crowd went wild. The next day we went to see the Olympic cauldron and rings, shopped for Olympic merchandise and went to the Pairs Short Program event. The first pair team to skate was Chen and Zhou, they were flawless and beautiful. Both of the American teams skated very well and looked thrilled to be there. One of the great things about being there in person is getting to see all of the teams. They were all so impressive.

The next morning we went to a practice session and got there just in time to see Evan practice his short program. He skated flawlessly and looked relaxed and confident. That night we saw the Pairs Long Programs. Again the skating was amazing. Walking through the arena I saw Scott Hamilton and got Scott Barrett's autograph (US pairs team skater). Seeing Chen and Zhou get the gold medal was another thrill.

The Men's Short Program was definitely a highlight. Again, we got to see 30 short programs and most of them skated clean. It was so exciting to see Evan skate so well. On the other hand it was heartbreaking to see Jeremy Abbott have such a rough skate. His parents were a couple of rows behind us and as Jeremy got off the ice he looked up to them and said "I'm sorry" and they responded that they still loved him. After Stephan Lambiel skated he came to sit with his family just a section over from where we were - wow! Then walking through the arena I saw Sasha Cohen and got her autograph, I got to visit with Oleg Vasiliev and was introduced to Vera Wang - what a night!



The next day we had a break from skating and went to see the Men's Snowboard Halfpipe event at Cypress Mountain. It was totally different than being at the skating events and quite thrilling. The crowd was rowdy and everyone went crazy when Shaun White came down the pipe. He is truly in a league of his own!

On our last day, I went to my first hockey game ever, USA vs. Norway and what a great experience it was for my first hockey game. The atmosphere was also fun and rowdy. A lot of Canadians were rooting for Norway but all in good fun. Fortunately the USA team won!

That night was the Men's Long Program. The whole arena was electric and there was so much anticipation, especially with the men's field being one of the strongest ever. Right before the event begins an announcer says "We are just waiting for 30 million people from around the world to join us." And then everyone counts down the last 10 seconds. As each group skated we grew more excited for the final group. Finally Evan took the ice and we held our breath as he skated. It was so wonderful to see him skate so beautifully. It seemed like the whole audience was behind him, except for some Russian fans. It was also great to see Johnny Weir skate so well. When the final scores came up and Evan won the gold the crowd went wild. Then hearing our National Anthem and seeing the US flag raised, I was definitely proud to be an American.



The whole Olympic experience was truly one of the greatest things I have ever gotten to be a part of. Vancouver is a beautiful city and the Canadians are the friendliest most welcoming people I have ever encountered. It was easy to get around, security was fast and efficient and there were volunteers everywhere. The volunteers truly helped make our experience even more special.

If you ever have a chance to go to an Olympics, I would highly recommend it. It exceeded all of my expectations and I hope to some day go to another!
